### NOTES TO TEACHERS

This resource is intended to give you activities for students to reinforce the times tables while introducing students to various aspects of Maori culture.

### There are 10 pictures:

- Puzzles 1 and 2 are in single colours.
- \* Puzzles 3 to 10 involve 2 or 3 tables which must be done in the correct order because of the **common multiples**. Common multiples are used in the first table only.
- \* Puzzle 9 (The Waka) is in 2 parts and is intended as an activity for 2 students or a 2 part activity for one student.
- Puzzle 10 (Whare Runanga) is in 4 parts and would be ideal as a group activity.

### **Community engagement**


The curriculum has meaning for students, connects with their wider lives, and engages the support of their families, whānau, and communities.



## SOLUTION PUZZLE 1: 4X TABLE DEPICTING THE TANIWHA: A MYTHICAL WATER SPIRIT


In Māori mythology, Taniwha are beings that live in deep pools in rivers, dark caves, or in the sea, especially in places with dangerous currents or deceptive breakers (Wikipedia). It is a water spirit, monster, chief, something or someone awesome - *taniwha* take many forms from logs to reptiles and whales and often live in lakes, rivers or the sea. They are often regarded as guardians by the people who live in their territory (Maori Online Dictionary).








# SOLUTION PUZZLE 2: 12X TABLE DEPICTING WHALE AND WHALE BONE CARVINGS





### SOLUTION PUZZLE 3: 11X AND 6X TABLES DEPICTING THE KORU





### SOLUTION PUZZLE 4: 3x and 10x tables depicting the manaia






# SOLUTION PUZZLE 5: 9x AND 2x TABLES DEPICTING TE MATAU A MAUI – THE HOOK OF MAUI

Te Matau a Maui or The Fish Hook of Maui is from an ancient Maori folklore in which Maui fishes up the islands of New Zealand.






# SOLUTION PUZZLE 6: 7x, 11X AND 12x tables depicting the map of New Zealand - Aotearoa


# SOLUTION PUZZLE 7: 3x, 5x and 8x tables depicting hei tiki




# SOLUTION PUZZLE 8: 7x and 6x tables depicting maori designs and weaving patterns

When completed, puzzles can be joined together to form a border around the classroom. The pattern matches up horizontally and vertically.







Waka Taua means war canoe. Allied tribes descended from the crew of a canoe which migrated to New Zealand (Maori Online Dictionary).


